

## AEP Online Foundations course outline

### Course description

AEP Online Foundations is the online version of the Adoption Education Program. This course has 12 modules, with a new module opening up each week. Each module will be open for 2 weeks, opening on the Thursday and closing 2 weeks later on Wednesday at midnight. This should allow participants plenty of time to complete the coursework and assignments. Coursework demands approximately 5 hours a week of your time. There will be a one-week break after week 6 to allow participants time to rest, reflect and get caught up. There are 5 mandatory one hour live online discussions during the 15 week course.

### Activities

The course is taught in a multi-media format and activities include:

- Reading articles
- Watching videos
- Listening to audios
- Watching presentations
- Offering written or audio journals
- Participating in online live group discussions
- Vocabulary building
- Answering questionnaires
- Taking quizzes

### Evaluation

You will be evaluated based on understanding and mastery of the material, your behaviour and participation, as well as your ability to demonstrate self-awareness and reflection.

### AEP-Online goals

To enable prospective adoptive parents to make realistic, well-informed decisions about their capacity and readiness to parent a child by adoption by providing education about core issues in adoption, as required by the Adoption Regulations.
